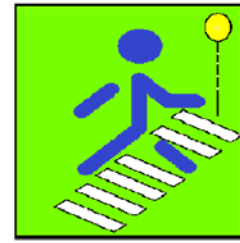




## FARNBOROUGH SOCIETY PEDESTRIAN FORUM

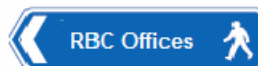

It is an opportunity for us all to discuss and bring up topics, ranging from those awkward and dangerous road-crossings we all hate, to ideas on better pedestrian ways in our town centre.

There are a whole range of topics that we shall touch upon including:-

- Pedestrian safety and road crossings.
- The special difficulties encountered by wheelchair or mobility scooter users and the visually impaired when crossing the road.
- Town centre routes and the importance of way signage and information maps.
- Making streets pedestrian friendly and concepts of shared space.
- Street audits and ways we can effectively record the good and the bad parts of a pedestrian route.

The forum also seeks to establish a smaller campaign group, freely formed from those of us who have the time and inclination to actively promote the forum's view point, on its behalf. We would present ideas to local authorities, organise street surveys of paths and pavements around the Borough, and gain the widest publicity for the pedestrian cause in Farnborough.
